# Blind Woodturner Exemplifies Courage to Thousands of Fans

When George Wurtzel closes his eyes, whales are not the only things he can hear. Most people recognize George as the star of a well-known Subaru TV commercial. Few people know him as an accomplished woodturner and furniture maker.

Totally blind since the age of 19, George has had to rely on his other senses to get by day to day. He doesn't need to read rpm on his lathe, he is totally reliant on sound. He doesn't need to see the angle of attack in his gouge, he can visualize it in his minds eye. He sees vibration more clearly than most folks who have perfect vision.

George attended the Michigan School for the Blind, at the same time as Stevie Wonder. He once made a one-third model of a Steinway Model D concert grand piano and gave it to the music legend. They remain friends to this day.



George's resume is impressive. He has been an auto mechanic, industrial arts teacher. As a former member of the US Paralympic team, he is an avid cross country skier. He once skied over 500 miles in Lapland.

"I love seeing see people succeed at what they like to do." To that end, George relocated to Greenville, TN where he bought a two story building, renovated it and put in a classroom where he teaches both sighted and visually impaired students.

At age 65, George shows no signs of slowing down, "my big thing is... I want to continue to teach. There are a lot of people getting up in age and think they have to quit woodturning because their vision is going bad. I recently had a student who had lost his vision and thought he had to give up woodturning. I told him the woodturning part was the hardest and he already knew how to do that. All I had to do was show him how to read a ruler as a blind man and he would be on his way. He had been turning for ten years and was ready to sell all the equipment he



had put together for when he retired. Well, he's still turning and doing fantastic now.

George's shop is equipped like most woodworking shops. It has a drill press, bandsaw, routers and big stacks of wood. A huge lathe resides in one corner of the room.

In one concession to his blindness, George does not use pencils in his shop. Instead, he works with a scribe for marking lines, that way he can feel where the line is. He also uses an audio-output measuring tape. Most woodworkers are surprised to learn that he does not use a blade guard on his table saw preferring to "feel" his way to the blade. A technique not for the faint of heart but, after 50 years of woodturning George still has 99% of his fingers. (He lost a tip a number of years ago when he fell asleep while turning).

Nevertheless, don't feel bad for George. While some may look at him and feel sympathy, he has no time for such sentiment. "I am not a big fan of whiners.", he says.
